



## SONGS OF PENTECOST JUNE 2014

**Rushing wind; tongues of fire; and a cacophony of many languages fill the Pentecost story as recorded in Acts 2. Several Pentecost anthems and hymns incorporate such images. This June 8 the choir anthem, “Come Down, O Love Divine” by Ralph Vaughan Williams, and two congregational hymns, “On Pentecost They Gathered” and “Every Time I Feel the Spirit,” focus on the drama of that first Pentecost.**

**Perhaps more enduring is the characterization of the Holy Spirit as our constant companion and comforter. There are many songs and hymns in our new hymnal, “Glory to God”, depicting the Holy Spirit in this way. “Breathe on Me Breath of God” and “Spirit of the Living God” fit this category.**

**A lovely new song, created in 2004, “invites us to sing about the Holy Spirit through fresh and beautiful images from creation, Scripture, and worship.” (Presbyterians Today, p. 4, August 2013) This song is “As the Wind Song” composed by a musician from Singapore and authored by a writer from New Zealand. We will use “As the Wind Song” on June 8.**

Dear Church Family,

When you hear the word exercise, what comes to mind? Is it some infomercial babe, with a savage tan, in a bikini, doing several hundred stomach crunches in 2 minutes, and smiling like she loves it? Or do you see you, trying to jog in a sweat suit drenched with sweat, looking like you are experiencing a near death moment.

What I would propose is that exercise does not have to be stupid or highly painful to be successful. Most doctors agree that if your goal is to be healthy (not to look like Arnold Schwartzegger) that all you need to do is walk and eat right!! Now, this is not your stop to smell the roses type of walk, this is a pace that will get your heart rate up kind of walk. And, the pace that gets your heart rate up is different for everyone.

Web MD has a site that helps you to determine what your Heart rate (pulse) should be to get the maximum benefit from walking. Your maximum heart rate is 220 minus your age. Your target heart range during exercise should be 50% and 85% of that number depending on what shape you're in. So, at age 50,  $220 - 50 = 170$  50% of 170 = 85 beats per minute (would be the low end of your range) and 85% of 170 = 146 beats per minute (would be the top end of your range). Certain medications keep your heart rate lower, so if this is your situation the target heart rate would drop. In general, walking fast enough to be slightly winded and tired enough to know you did something will probably get you where you need to be.

With the HOPE of warm weather and sunshine arriving soon, I would like to offer you an option to start walking with fellow parishioners by the lake. The first dates will be Monday, June 2 at 11am and Thursday, June 5 at 3pm. We will meet at the Chamber by the Gazebo. I will have water and can check Pulse, Bp and Oxygen Saturation readings if people would like. I have a few pedometers to loan out while you walk and will have log sheets for you to keep track of your exercising. I will have a Health Table set up in June with log sheets and exercise tips.

Benefits of a walking program include losing weight, maintaining a healthy weight, strengthening muscles and bones, preventing and/or managing diabetes and heart conditions, helping with balance and coordination, reducing stress and making you feel more positive.

We will decide on more dates and times for walking that work well after our first week. Call me with questions 315-759-9039.

## ***Let's Talk...About Issues This Summer***

*Summer gatherings devoted to informal discussions of issues following a dessert, wine and coffee time*

June 26 ***Educate and Activate.*** The central Finger Lakes region of New York State is a region in which agriculture has a multifaceted focus. And yet there are those in the area who go to bed hungry every night. Laurie Konwinski from Catholic Charities will share her expertise on local hunger focusing on direct service work, advocacy efforts and public policy. What can we do to advocate for the hungry and assure that the food we grow here is available to those who are hungry? A contribution for the local food pantry is welcomed. 



**Professional athletes often attain ability levels where they experience no distinction between themselves and their performance. They sometimes describe feeling "one" with their activity and environment. They are intensely focused, but without reflective self consciousness. A dancer once explained the sensation saying, "I was doing the dance and the dance was doing me". This experience is often referred to as "being in the zone".**

# *SERRV* International Fair Trade Gift Shop

The SERRV committee thanks our members and friends for their ongoing support this past church year. SERRV cares for people around the world and your support helps struggling artisans and farmers to help themselves. We have hosted several successful sales and have been able to make donations to several church and community projects—mission dollars at work. Hosting out of town sales at conferences takes tremendous volunteer work and we are grateful for your strong recognition of us and the help of many volunteers.

Since the founding of SERRV in 1949 SERRV has treated marginalized artisans and farmers with respect and dignity and has striven to increase the quantity and quality of products we purchase because every artisan our fair trade partners employ is one less person who could be exposed to exploitative and dangerous labor practices. Most of the artisans who make our products are women and SERRV only works with organizations that treat women as equals in all levels of decision-making. In many parts of the world, free public schools are not an option and parents can't afford the tuition fees. This means children miss the opportunity to learn. SERRV's partners pay artisans enough so they can cover school costs for their children and often these children become more highly educated than their parents. Several of our partners also invest proceeds from sales or donations to fund schools and scholarships in their local communities.

With summer upon us the shop will only be open upon request after June 22<sup>nd</sup> which will include Sundays after the 9:30 am service. A member of the committee will be happy to accommodate anyone wishing to find a gift any Sunday or during the week. **This coffee is grown in Chiapas, Mexico by members of a farmer-owned cooperative and then roasted and packaged in Sonora, Mexico. The idea behind Café Justo is to address one of the root causes of labor migration from Mexico to the USA: a lack of sustainable economic opportunities in Mexico.**

**Café Justo's mission is:**

**to deliver the highest quality, organic, environmentally conscious, fresh roasted coffee to customers at a price that is fair and just;**

**to provide the training and resources necessary for farmers to create and maintain a sustainable, small-scale, international coffee company, thus shifting the profits from large, international companies to the members of the cooperative;**

**to create a sustainable, local business which employs members of the community in agricultural production and management/administrative roles.**

**Coffees available include whole bean and ground, dark and regular roasts, and decaffeinated as well as regular.**

**We'll be taking orders in June. Payment will be due when coffee arrives. Prices will be about \$10 per pound.**
