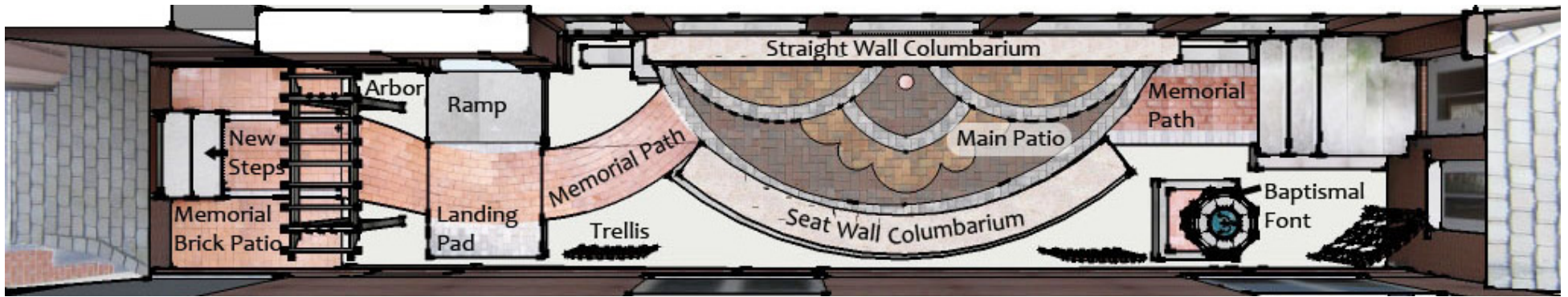

## THE MEMORIAL GARDEN & COLUMBARIA

We are excited about the construction of a memorial garden this year, located between the sanctuary and the ambulatory. The project was initiated by the Memorials and History Committee to better memorialize our members. It will add natural beauty to an unimproved area, provide an appropriate setting for services and committals, and with its two columbaria, provide members with interment at our church.

The names of members who pass away in 2012 and beyond will be engraved on memorial bricks in the walkways and rectangular patio, using money from the Memorials Fund.

With the support of the Session, the Memorials and History Committee is providing \$30,000 in current funds to the \$80,000 project. Additional funding to complete the project will come from the sale of niches and memorial bricks, and as people give gifts to the Memorials Fund in memory of loved ones and friends. It is also hoped that members will make donations specifically to support the creation of this lovely space.

There are several ways we can support the completion of the memorial garden. For those wishing to be interred in one of the columbaria,

niches will be available for individuals, couples, or family use. Individuals who are not church members may be included. Those who wish to honor and memorialize passed members may contribute \$100 to have their loved one's name engraved on a memorial brick. For those whose future plans are complete elsewhere, but who feel the garden will be a wonderful addition, donations would be greatly appreciated in lessening the financial impact to the future Memorials Fund.

Donations of plant material appropriate for the site and of volunteer gardening time would also be gladly accepted.

May our legacy of generosity through all our projects, including the memorial garden, make a real difference in the future of The Presbyterian Church in Geneva.

The Memorials and History Committee, comprised of Tom Burrall, Jerry Rose, Bob Bailey, Beth Reiners, and Ellyn Colquhoun, are eager to help all who want to know more.
